Today Sundays after Pentecost – Lectionary 17

Our long liturgical season of growth continues. On the altar, the green shoots are but a promise of the lush growth this season will eventually produce. Each week this sapling will grow, its colors mirroring the greens of the season. As the strips extend across the altar, they will form a cross that will ultimately enfold the entire space with every color of the growing season. We, the baptized congregation, are like these diverse strips: together we form the Body of Christ—one body composed of many diverse members.

Introduction to the Day

Today is the first of five Sundays with gospel readings from John 6, the first four of which focus on Jesus as bread of life. Today Jesus feeds thousands of people with five loaves and two fish. What we have, what we bring to Jesus' table seems like it is not nearly enough to meet all the needs we see around us. But it is not the adequacy of our supplies or our skills that finally makes the difference: it is the power of Jesus working in the littlest and least to transform this world into the world God desires, a world where all the hungry are satisfied.

Giving to Saint Luke

Here are some easy ways to make donations to Saint Luke:

- I. Go to <u>stlukechicago.org</u> and click on "**Donate**". The **Online** button will take you to the donation page. You can direct your money to the category you choose, such as: congregation, missions, building or special events. You can also choose the frequency of your donation.
- 2. **Paper form sign-up:** Sign up with **SimplyGiving** (through Vanco)— an easy and secure way to donate automatically. A form for your use includes a number of options from which to choose: credit/debit card, checking or savings account. It's as easy as getting a form from the church office and returning it to the church. You can also call 773.472.3383 and a form will be sent to you.
- 3. Send a **Text Message** to **833.988.0613** with the amount you would like to contribute (example: 25). Within a few minutes, you will be sent a text with a link to register. Click on the link and enter your cardholder name and debit or card information. Once your registration is complete, you will receive a text verification and a receipt of your donation via email.
 - For future giving, send a text with the amount you wish to give, and it will process automatically! You can even text "repeat" to make it a recurring donation. Text giving is one of the fastest and easiest ways to give.
- 4. Remember, as always, you can make your donation through **offering envelopes**, in the **offering basket**, or by using the giving **kiosk** in the Church Lobby.
