
Prayer for those who will not receive

Worship Space

On this Sunday, the **First Sunday in Lent**, the liturgy will look a little different. At the 10:30 a.m. service the Great Litany is sung. This litany is a prayer in which we remember all sorts and conditions of humanity. It is chanted as the procession takes a new direction into the chancel to emphasize Lent as a spiritual journey in which we are encouraged to change our direction to walk the way of the cross.

Second, beginning today and throughout all of Lent, the joyful Hymn of Praise "Glory to God in the Highest" is omitted. Third, the Alleluia is absent. It was "buried" on Shrove Tuesday and will not be sung until the announcement of the resurrection at the Easter Vigil when we again shout that ancient and joyful acclamation.



Introduction to the Day

On Ash Wednesday the church began its journey towards baptismal immersion in the death and resurrection of Christ. This year, the Sundays in Lent lead us to focus on five covenants God makes in the Hebrew Scriptures and to use them as lenses through which to view baptism. First Peter connects the way God saves us through the water of baptism. The baptismal covenant is made with us individually, but the new life we are given in baptism is for the sake of the whole world.
