VISION TEAM STATUS REPORT SESSIONS

On Sunday February 2nd, after each of the two Services, the first of an anticipated frequent series of Status Report Sessions were held. These Status Report Sessions will focus on the progress made by the Vision Team in their mandate to develop a Strategic Plan for the future of Saint Luke.

This first Presentation centered on the reporting of the outcomes of the Listening Sessions, sharing the Strategic Roadmap, and unveiling of the North Star Statement. That North Star (our guiding statement / lens through which the proposed Strategic Plan will be filtered) is "Saint Luke seeks to be a diverse urban and global community that shares Christ's love as our foundation".

A total of 45 individuals attended the Sessions. Each Session included a Question and Answer period which resulted in positive discussions. This input was welcomed by the Vision Team and will further inform the Vision Team's work. Copies of the Presentation – "2020 Saint Luke Operational Plan: Phases 1 and 2 Status Report"- are available in hard-copy format in the Church Office.
