Introduction to the Day

On the fiftieth day of Easter we celebrate the Spirit, through whom and in whom the people of God are created and re-created. Pentecost is sometimes called the church's birthday, but might more appropriately be called its baptism day, since the gift of the Spirit is the fullness of baptism. Ezekiel's vision shows the Spirit resurrecting and re-creating not just individuals but a whole people. Romans makes it clear that God is in the process of re-creating the entire cosmos; yet the Spirit is also at work in the most intimate and personal way, praying in us "with sighs too deep for words" when we do not know how to pray.

Easter Celebration

As we celebrate this day of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, the church environment recalls the wind, sound and fire of the first Pentecost. Filling the walls, leaping the chasms of time and space to ignite new "fires" on distant walls, restless and ever-moving, **the red surrounding us are reminders that our lives are filled with the gifts of this same Spirit who empowered the timid disciples to bold declarations for the Good News of Jesus Christ.**

The swirling flames and rushing noise that surround us and the red streamers we receive as we leave the service are symbols that we share the apostles' mission to take this Gospel out into all the world, challenged and empowered by the Spirit of the Lord which fills the world.
