

Introduction to the Day

John called people to repent, to clear the decks, to completely reorder their lives so that nothing would get in the way of the Lord's coming. The reading from Isaiah gives the context for this radical call: the assurance of forgiveness that encourages us to repent; the promise that the coming one will be gentle with the little ones. Isaiah calls us all to be heralds with John, to lift up our voices fearlessly and say, "See, your God is coming!" We say it to one another in worship in order to say it with our lives in a world in need of justice and peace.

Today

The second week of Advent—we see the signs and prepare for the Messiah! Two of the four candles in the Advent wreath are lighted to mark the progress of the season. The lessons and hymns for the day call for active preparation. We work to make our hearts ready and thus prepare the way for the One who will come to us at Christmas as our Savior.



During the season of Advent an important part of our liturgy is omitted. "Glory to God in the Highest," the great hymn of praise usually sung at the beginning of the service, was the proclamation of the Christmas angels who announced the Savior's birth to shepherds. As we prepare for the coming of the Savior, we remember that earth has not yet seen the angels or heard their song. This hymn will be restored to our service on Christmas Eve when we of earth will join heaven's angels in announcing the birth of the Savior.


